- 5. Mopane Tree

Nevertheless, the proposed trees to be planted are not limited to the above list.

Furthermore, the Sam Nujoma Foundation aims to actively engage the Namibian youth through a social media campaign that encourages them to plant trees and share their actions and messages online in celebration of this important initiative. Let's make Namibia green as he had a vision even to plant trees in our deserts.

As we continue to pay tribute to the selfless sacrifices, unwavering commitment and service to humanity of revered Founding President, let us unite and work together for the better Namibia that he envisioned.

Similarly, we should look at some of his initiatives that he did not complete so that we complete them such as the Etunda Farm Primary School that he intended to donate to government in order to provide education to children of farm labourers in the district of Otavi and beyond.
